-  **Maintenance advice:** At the end of winter, remove dead wood as well as the branches that are making shade to the young shoots inside the tree. Shorten the branches that are too long.
-  **Botanical/Horticultural origin:** Discovered on the banks of the Ayr river (Scotland) around 1850
-  **Use group:** Shrubs
-  **Height at 10 years:** 3 m
-  **Width at 10 years:** 3 m
