

HYDRANGEA arborescens 'ANNABELLE'

hydrangea 'Annabelle'



Hardy deciduous shrub, pale green leaves, spectacular round white flowers up to 30cm wide.



Maintenance advice: In March, remove dead or weak wood and prune the branches 30cm above the ground surface to get very large flowers (often one huge flower per stem). Water regularly in dry weather.



Botanical/Horticultural origin: Eastern US; found in Anna, Illinois (US) around 1910



Use group: Shrubs
