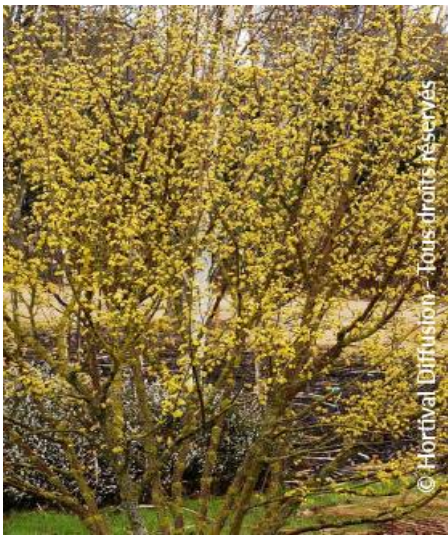















CORNUS officinalis

-  **Maintenance advice:** At the end of winter, cut off any dead wood. Tolerates pruning after flowering if you want to maintain it as a shrub. Water abundantly and regularly for the first 2 years.
-  **Botanical/Horticultural origin:** China, Japan, Korea : introduced around 1870
-  **Use group:** Shrubs
-  **Height at 10 years:** 6 m
-  **Width at 10 years:** 3 m
-  **Growth:** Fast
-  **Fragrance:** No

-  **Exposure:** Sun - Half shade
-  **Evergreen/Deciduous:** Deciduous
-  **Shape:** tree like
-  **Colour of leaves:** Green
-  **Colour of flowers:** Yellow
-  **Soil type:** Cool to dry
-  **Uses:** Free standing specimen, Border, Country hedge
