giant redwood, big tree



-  **Maintenance advice:** Pruning, generally unnecessary, can be done to shorten or remove branches too low, after a few years, or to thicken young subjects to form a pyramidal form.
-  **Botanical/Horticultural origin:** California, USA ; discovered by Dr. Kellogg (US) 1863
-  **Use group:** Conifers
-  **Height at 10 years:** 20 m
-  **Width at 10 years:** 6 m
-  **Growth:** Fast
